Slide Structure
Use built-in slide layouts to ensure proper reading order and structure.
Maintain a consistent layout and design across all slides.
Use unique slide titles for each slide to aid navigation.
Text and Formatting
Use sans-serif fonts (e.g., Arial, Calibri, Verdana) for readability.
Ensure font size is at least 18pt for body text and larger for headings.
Avoid using color alone to convey meaning.
Maintain high contrast between text and background (minimum 4.5:1).
Use bold or italic for emphasis, not underlining (except for links).
mages and Graphics
Provide alt text for all meaningful images, icons, and charts.
Mark decorative images as decorative (if using PowerPoint 365 or later).
Avoid using text within images ; if necessary, repeat the text in the slide content.



Chai	rts and Graphs		
	Include alt text that summarizes the key message of the chart.		
	Use data labels and legends to clarify information.		
	Ensure color choices in charts are distinguishable by users with color blindness.		
Multimedia			
	Provide captions or transcripts for all audio and video content.		
	Avoid autoplay for multimedia elements.		
	Ensure videos do not flash more than three times per second (to avoid seizures).		
Read	ding Order		
	Check and correct the reading order of slide elements (Home > Arrange > Selection Pane).		
	Ensure logical tab order for keyboard navigation.		
Hyperlinks			
	Use descriptive link text (e.g., "Company Website" instead of "Click here").		
	Ensure links are underlined and clearly distinguishable from other text.		



Lang	Language and Readability		
	Set the slide language (Review > Language > Set Proofing Language).		
	Use plain language and avoid jargon or complex sentence structures.		
	Use spell check to correct typos and grammar issues.		
Animations and Transitions			
	Use simple, subtle animations (e.g., "Fade" or "Appear") and avoid distracting effects.		
	Avoid auto-playing animations ; allow users time to process content.		
	Do not use flashing or blinking effects that exceed three flashes per second.		
	Ensure animated elements follow a logical reading order .		
	Provide textual descriptions or speaker notes for animations that convey meaning.		
	Use simple transitions between slides and avoid disorienting effects or sound.		
Accessibility Checker			
	Run the built-in Accessibility Checker (Review > Check Accessibility).		
	Address all issues and suggestions provided by the checker.		

Presentation Delivery
Provide the presentation in multiple formats (e.g., PDF, accessible HTML).
Share speaker notes or transcripts for live presentations.
Ensure keyboard accessibility for interactive elements.
