An intensive 2-week elective experience to explore and reflect on the history of health professional involvement in the Holocaust, focusing on this legacy for ethics today and in the future.

Who should apply: Health science students and post-graduate trainees including residents and fellows from a wide range of training programs including medicine, nursing, pharmaceutical sciences, dental medicine, public health, psychology, physical and occupational therapy, and other clinical programs. Learners from health sciences-focused humanities disciplines such as medical history or medical anthropology are also welcome.

Format: Following a week-long curriculum on history, contemporary implications and future directions for health care, fellows will have the unique opportunity of direct interaction with the keynote speaker(s) for the University of Colorado's Holocaust Genocide and Contemporary Bioethics Remembrance Program. Fellows will also work together on a project during the 2-week period and may participate as panelists for the Remembrance Program to present their work.
