An intensive 2-week elective experience to explore and reflect on the history of health professional involvement in the Holocaust, focusing on this legacy for ethics today and in the future.

Join us this spring at the University of Colorado Anschutz Medical Campus.

Who should apply: Health science students and post-graduate trainees including residents and fellows from a wide range of training programs including medicine, nursing, pharmaceutical sciences, dental medicine, public health, psychology, physical and occupational therapy, and other clinical programs. Learners from health sciences-focused humanities disciplines such as medical history or medical anthropology are also welcome.

**Format:** Week one comprises a core curriculum on *Medicine*, *Nazism and the Holocaust: Contemporary Implications and Future Directions*. Week two includes the opportunity to work with our Remembrance Week keynote speaker, international lawyer and human rights scholar, <u>Philippe Sands</u>, author of *East-West Street: On the Origins of Genocide and Crimes Against Humanity*. Fellows will develop a project together during the 2-week period and may serve as panelists for the Remembrance Program.
