Title: Screening Admitted Patients for Palliative Care Needs in the Emergency Department

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Problem Statement: Early palliative care (PC) consultation from the emergency department (ED) for admitted patients leads to improved patient outcomes. A seamless screening tool to trigger an ED PC consult is challenging due to the ED's unique workflow.

Background: Research on ED PC referrals demonstrates benefit in patient care, length of stay, and hospital costs.¹ The Palliative Care and Rapid Emergency Screening tool, a proposed algorithm to identify ED patients with unmet PC needs,² would not be utilized at our hospital due to its complexity and time constraints.

Purpose: This quality improvement project's purpose is to increase ED PC referrals by developing a feasible, simple screening tool that identifies admitted patients who would benefit from PC consultation.

Methods: A new screening tool was developed and implemented on August 1, 2022. ED staff education occurred from July-October 2022. Data were obtained on consults from August-October 2022 as compared to May-July 2022.

Findings: While data are limited, there is a clear trend towards increased consults. Three months after tool implementation, the consult rate increased by 8% on average.

Practice Implications: The ED is in a unique position to identify appropriate admitted patients that would benefit from PC. Its complex workflow interferes with providing this invaluable service. A brief, simple screening tool increases ED PC consults for admitted patients. Further data must be obtained over time to ensure the validity of this tool.
