
Dear Graduate:

Leslie J. Berg, PhD Joseph Addison Sewall Award

Leslie Berg, PhD, Chair of Immunology and Microbiology, is recognized worldwide for her contributions to scientific discovery. At the University of Colorado School of Medicine, she is known for visionary leadership, dedication to excellence, and commitment to equitable support for all programs, in resources, connections, and attention.

This powerful combination of scientific expertise and administrative skill results in a remarkable impact for her department, the university, and our community.

Dr. Berg joined the CU School of Medicine in 2019 as Chair of Immunology and Microbiology and became Director of the Human Immunology and Immunotherapy Initiative in 2021. Her groundbreaking discoveries have shaped our understanding of T-cell development, the foundation of protective immunity and infection. Her peers have recognized her achievements with the 2025 American Association of Immunologists Lifetime Achievement Award.

As an educator, Dr. Berg is an invaluable campus resource, serving as editor of the textbook used for the university's core course in immunology. As Professor Ross Kedl, PhD, notes: "In this case, one could quite literally say that Leslie Berg 'wrote the book' on immunology."

Dr. Berg has been deeply engaged in mentoring the next generation of scientists, fostering inclusivity, and ensuring students and trainees have access to outstanding educational opportunities. Soon after joining CU, she led a committee that recommended reforming the campus biomedical graduate training programs. The resulting integration of programs with departments in the school has led to greater collaboration in pursuit of excellent PhD training programs.

Dr. Berg's professional service at the international level is impressive. In addition to service as President of the American Association of Immunologists, she has contributed to major scientific advisory boards including the NIH Board of Scientific Counselors for the National Institute of Aging, the National Cancer Institute, and the National Institute of Arthritis and Musculoskeletal and Skin Diseases.

On campus, Dr. Berg supported community engagement with an unprecedented departmental commitment to faculty working with local K-12 science initiatives and outreach pipelines to community colleges. The effort has recently grown into science communication and promotion, extending the reach of our campus into the community. Her commitment to campus and affiliate partners has been equally extraordinary. She has served on high-profile search committees, helping recruit the new Dean for the School of Medicine and the new Chair of Immunology and Genomic Medicine at National Jewish Health.

Dr. Berg's leadership style, combining integrity, vision, generosity, and humor, strengthens the campus and inspires her colleagues. She has been a constructive and effective bridge between basic and clinical departments, ensuring collaboration and communication thrive across disciplines.

For her contributions to transformational change at the Anschutz Medical Campus, Dr. Berg is highly deserving of the Joseph Addison Sewall Award.

Bryan R. Haugen, MD Joseph Addison Sewall Award

Bryan Haugen, MD, Professor of Medicine and Pathology, has an impressive record of productive investigation, prolific mentorship, and outstanding leadership, and he has been instrumental in elevating the quality of clinical care, research, and education in the Endocrinology Division at the University of Colorado School of Medicine.

Dr. Haugen joined the CU School of Medicine in 1993 and rose to become Head of the Division of Endocrinology, Metabolism, and Diabetes in 2007, serving in that leadership role until last summer.

As a clinician and researcher focusing on thyroid cancer, his accomplishments put him at the forefront of medical care and scientific research. His study, published in the New England Journal of Medicine, established a pioneering precision medicine approach to diagnosing thyroid cancer that has become a standard of care and that has prevented thousands of unnecessary thyroid surgeries.

In 2015, he was the first author of the American Thyroid Association's guidelines for managing differentiated thyroid cancer, setting the gold standard for thyroid cancer management still used today by clinicians worldwide.

These clinical research discoveries led to the founding of a state-of-the-art Thyroid Cancer Treatment Program at the Anschutz Medical Campus, bringing together endocrine surgeons, pathologists, nuclear medicine physicians, and radiologists to care for patients with the most difficult-to-treat forms of thyroid cancer.

He also put this expertise to work in 2023 by founding a thyroid cancer multidisciplinary clinic. In a single day, a patient is evaluated, discussed at the tumor board, meets with an endocrinologist and endocrine surgeon, and is prepared and scheduled for surgery. This clinic, one of the few of its kind, accepts patients from across the country.

While offering the best care for today's patients, Dr. Haugen also has ensured that future patients will receive expert compassionate care. More than 50 endocrinology fellows and 21 basic and clinical researchers have received their subspecialty training from him. First-year endocrine fellows learn inpatient endocrinology from him during their first weeks of training.

In his nomination letter, Associate Professor Daniel Bowles, MD, wrote: "As important as his excellence as a clinician, researcher, and administrator, Bryan is simply the kind of person we all hope our leaders can be. He is humble and interested in others. I've enjoyed our chats about road biking (though I can't bring myself to ride with him for fear of slowing him down), and in the last four years I've had the good fortune of singing tenor next to Bryan in our church choir. He truly is a renaissance man."

For exceptional leadership, compassionate service to patients, and unparalleled mentorship, Dr. Haugen is an ideal choice for the Joseph Addison Sewall Award.

Where Legends Are Made: The Enduring Legacy of Dr. Loretta Ford

At CU Anschutz, we believe that legends aren't born—they're made through foresight, grit, and the courage to transform possibilities into reality. No one represents this spirit more profoundly than CU alumna Dr. Loretta Ford, whose groundbreaking contributions to healthcare we honor today.

Many don't know her by name, but in nursing circles, Loretta Ford is revolutionary. Unlike Clara Barton, the teacher, humanitarian, and nurse celebrated as the founder of the American Red Cross, Ford transformed the profession in the 1960s through her pioneering approach to modern nursing practice.

In January of this year, we said goodbye to Dr. Ford who passed away at the remarkable age of 104. Recognized as one of nursing's greatest legends and an alumna of CU Nursing, Dr. Ford's journey began when she joined the military in 1942. After her service, she came to our Boulder campus, setting her on a path that would forever change the landscape of healthcare.



In 1965, Dr. Ford, alongside Dr. Henry Silver from the School of Medicine, co-created the world's first nurse practitioner program here at CU Nursing. This cutting-edge initiative was born from her keen observation of healthcare disparities in rural Colorado and her steadfast belief that nurses could do more, be more, serve more. Dr. Ford saw beyond limitations to possibilities. When confronted with obstacles, she built bridges between nursing and medicine. Her vision laid the foundation for a new healthcare model that has since changed care delivery across the nation and world. Today, hundreds of thousands of nurse practitioners carry forward her legacy, including many who graduated from our program.

Those who knew Dr. Ford remember her as a force of nature who didn't take "no" for an answer. Her vibrant personality—sometimes appearing as Superwoman or the Fairy Godmother—lit up every room. But beneath the sparkle was a will to elevate nursing and improve patient care through education, innovation, and expanded practice.

Dr. Ford's revolutionary vision earned her countless honors. Healthcare leaders worldwide recognized her as one of the most influential figures in modern healthcare.

As you receive your degrees today, remember that Dr. Ford's legacy lives on in each of you. Every time a healthcare provider reaches an underserved community or converts a challenge into an opportunity, her vision continues to change the world.

This is where legends are made—not just in our past, but through you, our graduates, and the future you create.

ACADEMIC DRESS

The tradition of the academic costume apparently began during the twelfth or thirteenth century in the early European universities.

Since the clergy comprised the majority of the educated class, academic dress is an adaption of the cope or mantle, which was usually silk or wool, and worn by church dignitaries in religious processions.

Through the years, great diversity developed in color and in style of cap, gown and hood. In 1896 the colleges and universities in the United States adopted a uniform code governing

academic dress.

While it is not apparent to the observer, the gowns worn by the recipients of the various degrees vary somewhat in design. The sleeves of the gown worn by the baccalaureate candidate are long and pointed, while the sleeves of the gown worn by the master s degree recipient are square at one end with a slit at the elbow. The doctor s gown has flowing sleeves with three bars of velvet and a facing of velvet down the front of the gown.

Those who are receiving a master s or doctor s degree from the University of Colorado wear hoods lined with the school colors, silver and gold. The hood worn by the doctor s candidate differs in design from that of the master s as it has side panels and is slightly longer. The velvet border of the hood indicates the degree and usually follows the same code as the color of the tassels.

The Oxford cap, usually referred to as a mortar board, has a long tassel which is fastened by a button on the top. The color of the tassel on the cap indicates the field of study. THE NORLIN CHARGE TO GRADUATES

(From the Baccalaureate address by President George Norlin of the University of Colorado, June 1935)

"You are now certified to the world at large as alumni of the University. She is your kindly mother and you her cherished sons and daughters.

"This exercise denotes not your severance from her, but your union with her. Commencement does not mean, as many wrongly think, the breaking of ties and the beginning of a life apart. Rather it marks your initiation in the fullest sense into the fellowship of the University, as bearers of her torch, as centers of her influence, as promoters of her spirit.

"The University is not the campus, not the building on the campus, not the faculties, not the students of any one time-not one of these or all of them. The University consists of all who come into her and go forth from her halls, who are touched by her influence and who carry on her spirit. Wherever you go, the University goes with you. Wherever you are at work, there is the University at work. "What the University purposes to be, what it must always strive to be, is represented on its seal, which is stamped on your diplomas-a lamp in the hands of youth. If its light shines not in you and from you, how great is its darkness! But if it shines in you today, and in the thousands before you, who can measure its power?

"With hope and faith, I welcome you into the fellowship. I bid you farewell only in the sense that I pray you may fare well. You go forth, but not from us. We remain, but not severed from you. God go with you and be with you and us."
