- APS 5060 is rewriting and redefining all the faculty titles. A draft is currently being distributed to faculty leadership for feedback. They are redefining the clinical teaching track and creating new titles for those previously on the CTT who are not in health care.

- APS 5060, there are things that have been clarified in all the titles. This is a major review and revision of this policy. Some of the biggest changes are in the IRC categories. Please pay close attention to the Clinical Teaching Track updates. They also clarify how things get used on the Anschutz Medical Campus, and as feedback from the other institutions comes in, we need to protect our exceptions, since they often only affect Anschutz. There is conversation about the Professor of Practice title, we can use that in the school of public health with the chancellor's discretion. It does not need to be added to APS 5060.
- The Graduate School dean search is well underway. There are 3 finalists, and public feedback will be coming in shortly. It is a .5 position and only on the Anschutz Campus. The candidates are posted on Dr. Nairn's website.
- The Dean for the School of Public Health search is also underway. They are in the confidential phase still; the search committee will recommend public finalists to come to campus soon.
