- Make a list of 5-10 colleges

- Make an email solely for college applications

not necessary, but will help you keep track and be more organized!

- Create FSA ID → *yours & your parent's SSN are needed.* (If parents don't have an SSN, then not necessary, but you still need yours! If you don't have one, Sam and Gabby can help!)

- Create FAFSA

(Opens on **October 1st** of each year! The earlier you finish, the higher your chances of getting more money!)

- Create accounts for applications

- Retake SAT/ACT (ask counselors for test wavers)

- Know your deadlines

- Gather recommendations

→ give teachers/counselors & recommenders at least **3 weeks** to write the letter!

- Write personal statement(s) (relate back to yourself, or turn your experience into an interesting story)

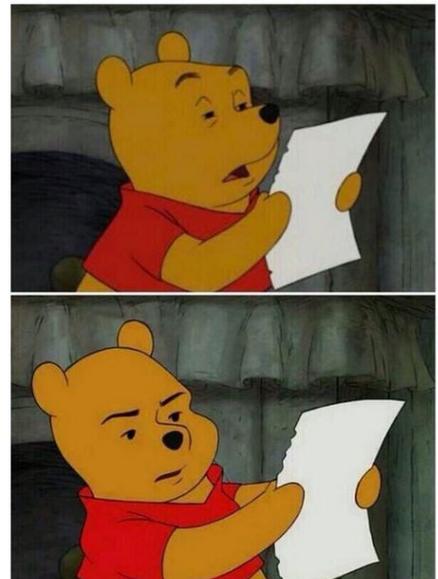
- Create Academic Resume → Extracurriculars, Awards, GPA, Volunteer/Work experience, Classes, Programs. This can also be used when you ask for recommendations.

- Connect your Common App to your Naviance (if necessary)

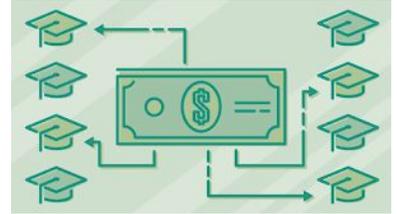
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- ❑ Talk to Counselors
 - ❑ Save essays for future reference
 - ❑ Apply to Scholarships
 - ❑ Fill out institutional Financial aid forms once acceptance is received
 - ❑ Fill out housing application (if necessary)
 - ❑ Sign up for Orientation

FINANCIAL AID INFORMATION



➤ **FAFSA opens October 1st** (EACH YEAR!)

- Create FSA ID: <https://fsaid.ed.gov/npas/index.htm>

(SSN needed & parents need to make an account different from your own, remember your account information as you will reapply each year)

(FSA ID will be used to sign your FAFSA)

- Fill out 2021-2022 FAFSA Application

➤ You will need your **2019 taxes** (yours & parents if you work or filed as independent)

➤ List the schools you applied to, or plan on applying to on your FAFSA; This will send your **Student Aid Report (SAR)** to your schools.

- You can edit your application once it has been submitted; therefore you can add additional schools.

➤ **EFC (Expected Family Contribution):** Tells colleges how much money your family can pay for your education.

Colorado Opportunity Fund (COF) -provides a stipend for new and continuing in-state students going to college in Colorado. <https://cof.college-assist.org/Apply>

Applying for COF

Student Eligibility

Public Institutions

Undergraduate students at participating public institutions may receive a stipend from the College Opportunity Fund if they meet the following requirements:

- Enrolled at a state institution of higher education
 - Classified as an in-state student for tuition purposes
 - Have applied for and been accepted into the COF program
 - Have requested a payment from the COF on their behalf to their attending institution
 - Are receiving undergraduate instruction
 - Have not exceed their lifetime credit-hour limitation (145 credit hours) or have already completed their baccalaureate degree and are eligible to receive stipend payments for an additional 30 undergraduate credit hours
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SCHOLARSHIP TIPS

➤ DEADLINES! DEADLINES! DEADLINES!



- Plan out your essays early, and complete them at least 1 week early. → Gives yourself time to revise!
- Placing dates on a CALENDAR helps!

➤ Ask for recommendations EARLY! → Make a list of your accomplishments, extracurriculars, etc...

- Ask teachers, supervisors, etc.. who've known you for 1+ years or someone you have a good relationship with (non-family)

➤ Apply for the “**smaller**” scholarships

- Tend to be less competitive, **raising your chances of winning**



➤ “Bigger” scholarships are more competitive, but still **worth applying to!!** Make sure to build your resume! Search for more scholarships! Different scholarships have different deadlines throughout the school year.

➤ Start **applying for institutional scholarships** as soon as you receive acceptance!!!

- Ex. CU Succeeds Scholarship (CU Denver), Kanes Scholarship (UCCS)
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
