
Background

- Asthma is a leading cause of children's hospitalizations & \$56 billion annually.
- 44% children with asthma had uncontrolled asthma
- **8.2%** Children in Colorado have asthma
- Medications & school nurse management at school help control their asthma
- School nurses deal with an inefficient system of phone, faxing, and delayed access to necessary medical records about medications, medical orders, and healthcare plans for school.

- There was a total decrease in **both ED and Hospital** admissions before and after school nurse EHR access
- Students with asthma had significantly higher rates of ED and hospital admissions.
- School nurse access to medical records through an electronic health record may improve student health outcomes so they can be healthy, active, and ready to learn at school
